Grammar: Past continuous

What was the shark doing?

The shark was looking for small sea animals. It wasn't looking for big fish.

What were the lobsters doing?

The lobsters were walking along the bottom of the tank. They weren't swimming.

Grammar: Past continuous vs. Past simple

What **were** you **doing** when the lion escaped?

I **was watching** the koalas when the lions **escaped**! I **wasn't** watching the lion!

2. While I was watching them, I (**heard** / **was hearing**) a parrot trying to talk!
