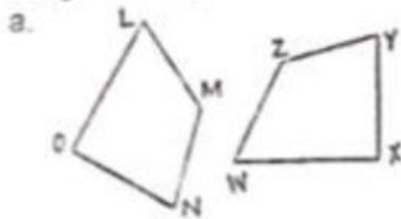

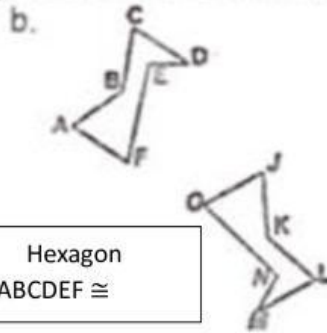

2. Each pair of figures are congruent. Identify the corresponding vertices, the congruent sides and the congruent angles. Then write a congruence statement for the two figures.



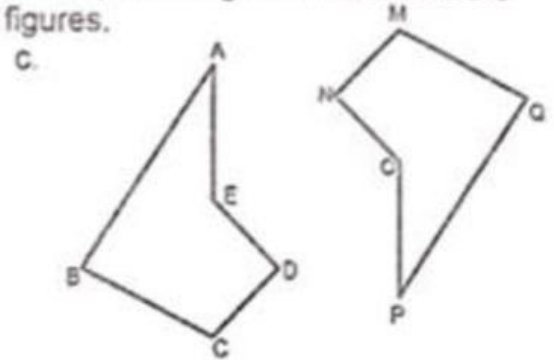
