A Festival for All Seasons

Every year, there are hundreds of music festivals all around the world. Here are just four.

Bahidorá, Mexico

At Bahidorá, you can dance with 6,000 other people under palm trees next to a tropical river. The music includes rock, hip-hop, and Latin fusion, and because it's in February, it's not only a music festival but also a colorful carnival.

Taico Club, Japan

It's small, with around 7,000 people, but fans of dance music love this festival in the mountains, a few hours by car from Tokyo. It's in May and it lasts 24 hours. It's short but exciting!

Glastonbury Festival, U.K.

At the first Glastonbury Festival in 1970, there were 1,500 people; around 200,000 people go every year! You can hear all styles of music, from metal to jazz, but take a rain jacket. It's in June, but it often rains – a lot!

Lake of Stars, Malawi

A blue lake and a beautiful beach make this African festival a magical experience. The first festival was in 2004, so it's quite new, but it's very popular. It's in September and there are only 4,500 tickets, so buy yours early!
