Until **recently**¹, when you thought about China, you may have thought about its most **popular**² drink, tea. Not long ago, however, Starbucks had **announced**³ its plan to open one new coffee shop in China – one new coffee shop every day, for five years! Starbucks had already opened many coffee shops there, and by 2021 it hoped to have about 5,000 shops across the country. However, when Starbucks opened its first coffee shop in China in 1999, business was not so good. At the same time, a few other American businesses in China (such as McDonalds and KFC) were also not doing very well, and the Chinese **economy**⁴ had begun to **slow down**⁵. So, was the Starbucks plan successful? Yes, it was! It was successful because the CEO of Starbucks was **optimistic**⁶, and he didn't give up. He said Starbucks would succeed "if the stores are **operated by**⁷ Starbucks people." More and more Chinese people have since begun to drink coffee, and there are now well over 5,000 Starbucks coffee shops across China! Now, most Starbucks **customers**⁸ in the world are still American, but soon most Starbucks customers may be Chinese.
