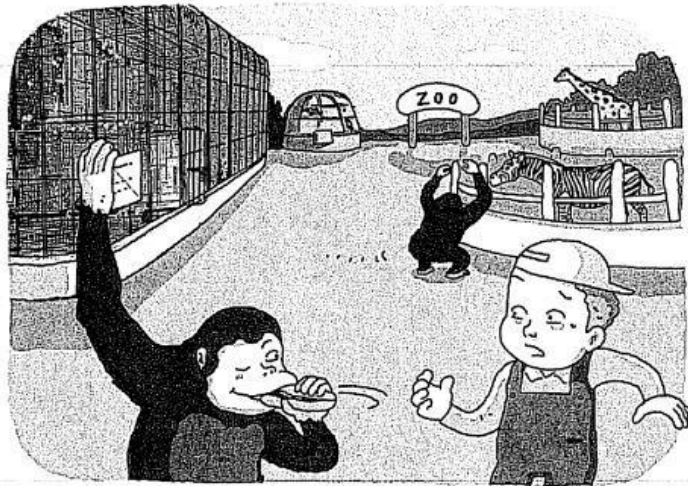

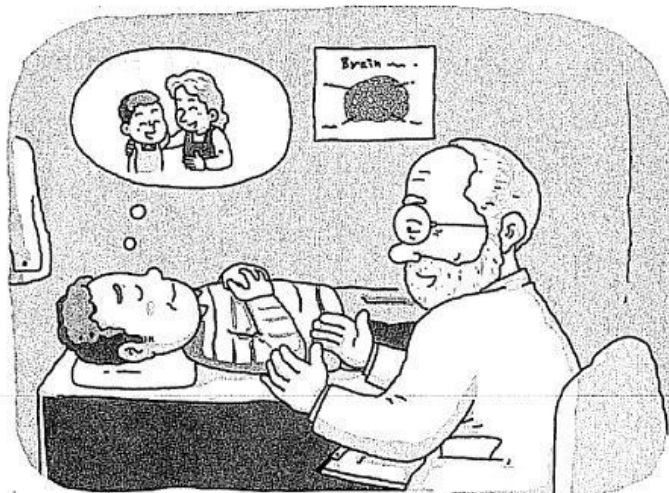


1 Sigmund Freud was a well-known psychologist who was born in Austria in 1856. He is famous because he came up with psychoanalysis. Psychoanalysis is a certain way of helping a patient with a troubled mind. Freud believed that people have many thoughts and ideas deep inside, but they are taught to ignore them over time.

5 Psychoanalysts help people by searching for their secret ideas. They will ask the patient many questions about their dreams, desires, and childhood. Then they will try to find out what all of this means.

Freud believed that a person's personality was not caused by genetics, but was formed by things that happened to the person as a child. For example, if a grown woman is very shy,
10 Freud would say that something happened when she was a child that made her that way. He believed that the way parents and siblings treated a child affected them as adults.

According to Freud, each person's mind has three parts: the *id*, *ego*, and *superego*. The *id* is the part of the mind that only wants pleasure and cannot think about bad consequences. The *superego* is a person's sense of doing what they are supposed to do. The *ego* is the part
15 of the mind that balances the *id* and the *superego*. Freud believed that if these parts of the mind were explored, a person could be cured of their psychological sickness.
