We use **should**, **let's**, **why don't we** and **how about** to make suggestions and offer ideas or plans.

• should/shouldn't + bare infinitive	• We should make toy animals to sell at the craft fair.
• Let's (not) + bare infinitive	• Let's (not) go to the bake sale.
• Why don't we + bare infinitive?	• Why don't we volunteer to help poor children?
• How about + V-ing?	• How about organizing a car wash?
• How about + Subject + Verb (Present Simple)?	• How about we join a fun run?

Pronunciation

Word stress in compound nouns

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- A compound noun is made up of two or more words. They can be written in one word (**peanut**), with a space (**hot dog**) or with a hyphen between words (**make-up**).
- We usually put the stress on the first word in a compound noun.
