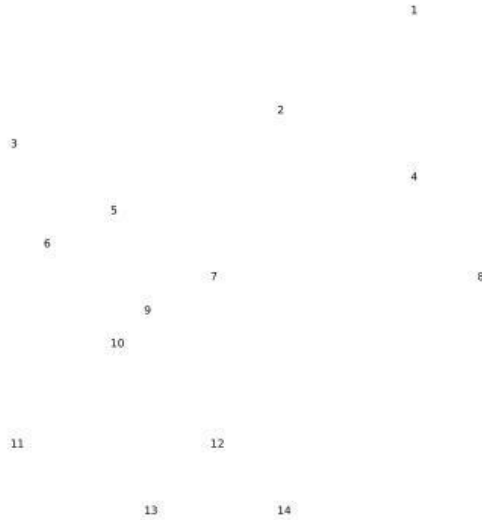


# Crossword Puzzle

1. Features of speech that extend over more than one segment, including aspects like stress, intonation, and timing.
2. A unit of sound that has one vowel sound and may be surrounded by consonants.
6. A speech sound characterized by constriction or closure at one or more points along the vocal tract.
7. A feature in some languages where a burst of air accompanies the release of certain consonants, like /p/ in "pat."
8. The study of the physical sounds of human speech, including their production and perception.
9. A speech sound produced without significant constriction of the airflow in the

3. The study of how sounds function within a particular language or languages.
4. Emphasis on a particular syllable or word in speech, often involving changes in pitch and duration.
5. Sounds produced with the tongue against the alveolar ridge, such as /t/ and /d/.r

11. A speech sound produced with a lowering of the velum, allowing air to escape through the nose.
