Use **some** in affirmative sentences. If it is followed by a plural noun, the verb should be plural. If it is followed by an uncountable noun, the verb should be singular.

Use **any** in questions and negatives. If it is followed by a plural noun, the verb should be plural. If it is followed by an uncountable noun, the verb should be singular.

None is usually followed by a singular verb.
