**An incredible scientist**

Stephen Hawking (1942–2018) was one of the most famous scientists in the world. He grew up in the south of England with his parents, two younger sisters and younger brother. At his first school, in London, he didn't learn to read. He then studied at a girls' school that was nearer to his home for a few months. Hawking's friends called him 'Einstein' and he often did projects with his maths teacher. When he went to university, he was bored and he said the work was easy, but he didn't study very much. He liked music, science fiction and he also joined the boat club.

Hawking's health problems began when he was 21. He couldn't walk, write or speak very well. At the same time, he started to be successful in his career. He made many discoveries in physics and space science. Hawking wrote books about science and he also wrote children's stories with his daughter, Lucy.

In 2007, Hawking flew in a special plane that was preparation for a journey as a space tourist. Unfortunately, he died before his trip became possible.
