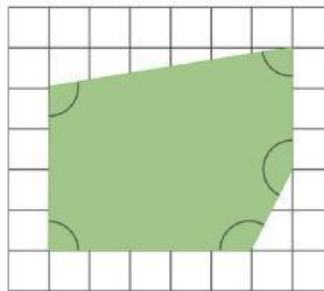

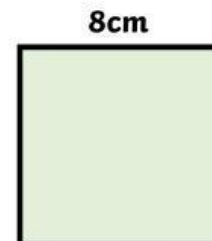

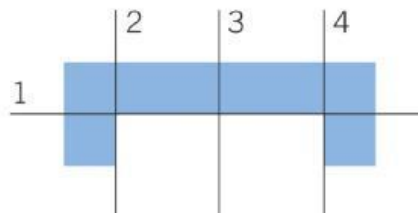

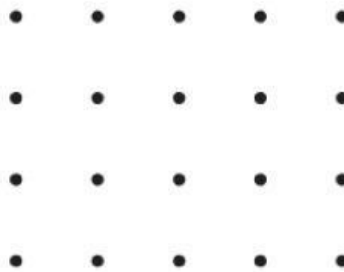

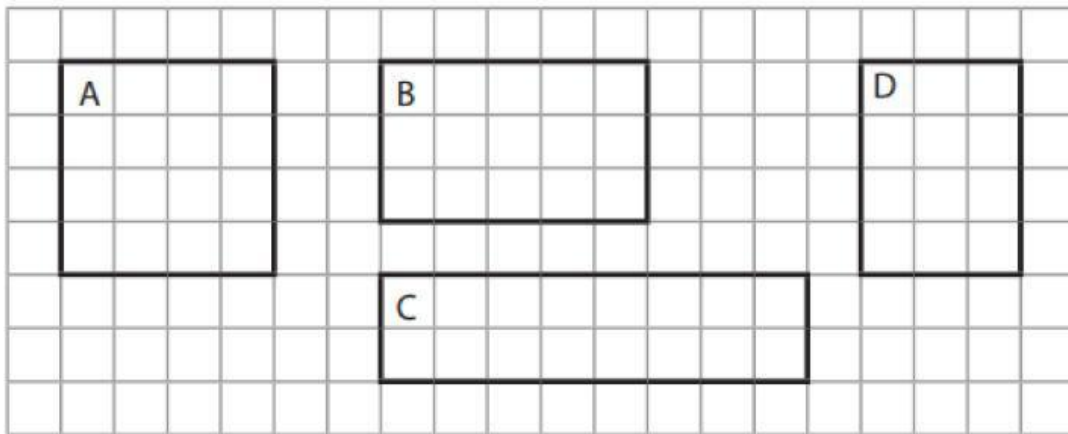
13. Here is a dotted grid.

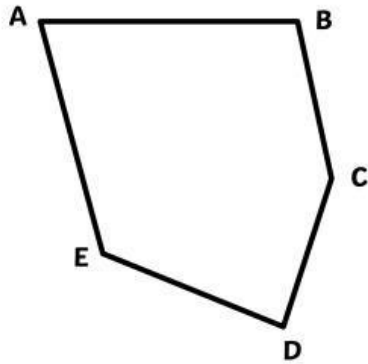

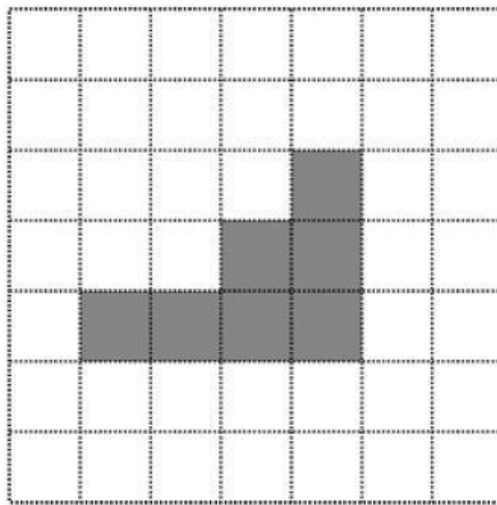


What is the measure of the biggest angle in the shape?

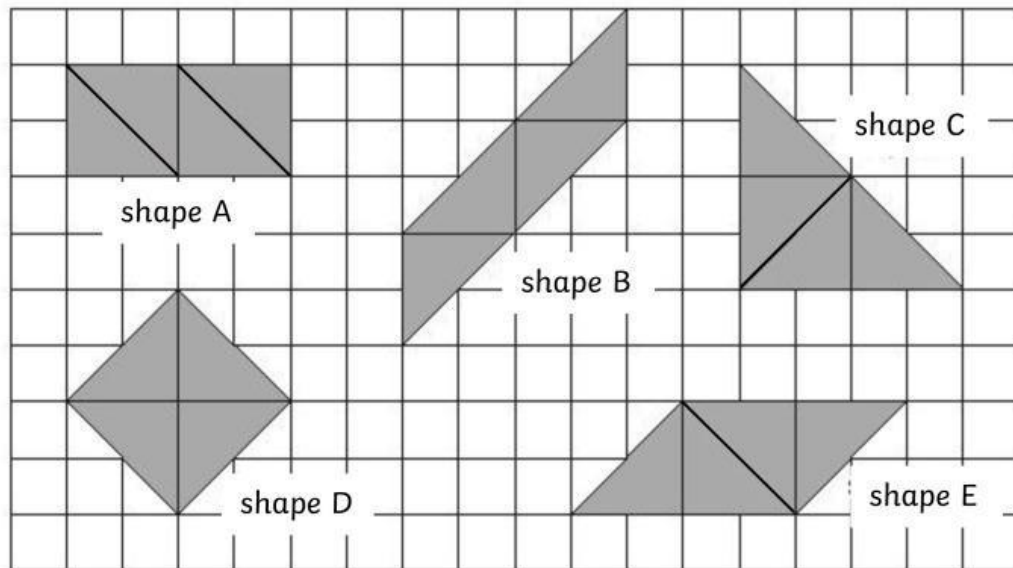
17. Solve the following problem. Show your work.
