People often think that **plastic surgery** is a modern American invention, _____ 1 _____. However, thousands of years before America was discovered by Columbus, Indian doctors did complicated plastic surgery. A medical textbook titled the *Sushruta Samhita*, which was written in approximately 600 B.C., gives detailed instructions for doing "nose jobs"—_____ 2 _____.

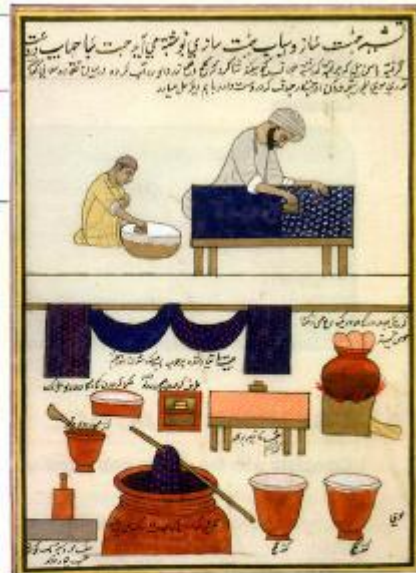
Brightly colored **cotton clothes** were made in India four and a half thousand years ago. This was at a time when Europeans wore animal skins. Until cotton factories were developed in England 200 years ago, India supplied the world with cotton clothes.

Although we call them **Arabic numbers**, the numbers that we use today came from India, and it was

there that "zero" was invented in 499 A.D. The Romans had counted using letters (M=1000, D=500, C=100, L=50, X=10, V=5, and I=1) _____ 3 _____. For example, four was written IV, forty XXXX, four hundred CCCC, and four thousand MMMM. However, in the new Indian system, using zero, the same numbers were written 4, 40, 400, 4,000.

Chocolate was invented over 2,500 years ago! The Mayans and Aztecs lived in parts of Mexico and Central America from 600 B.C. _____ 4 _____. They made a cold, thick drink called *xocolatl* from the fruit of the tree. Although the Mayans and Aztecs loved chocolate, Europeans didn't discover it for another two thousand years. In 1519, the Spanish explorer Cortés visited Emperor Montezuma II of Mexico. To the explorer's great surprise, he found that Montezuma drank 50 cups of chocolate a day.

Paper and printing were Chinese inventions. Paper was invented in 105 A.D. by Cai Lun, and the Chinese kept the process secret _____ 5 _____. Although paper was introduced into Japan in 610 A.D., it didn't reach the West until much later. A hundred years after paper was first made, printing was invented in China—over a thousand years before it was invented in Europe. In China, paper wasn't only used for books. Umbrellas, flags, and toilet paper were made from it, _____ 6 _____.
