Crocodiles and Alligators



Crocodiles and alligators are the largest reptiles in the world. They live in warm, moist places. They rely on their sharp teeth and **powerful** jaws to capture prey. They feed on a variety of animals such insects, frogs, fish, turtle and birds.

Alligators have wide, flat head with rounded **snouts**. The head of an alligator looks like the letter U. Crocodiles have pointed snouts. The head of a crocodile looks like the handle of a baseball bat. When alligators close their mouths, their lower teeth cannot be seen. In crocodiles, their lower teeth can be seen even when they shut their mouths tightly.

Unlike some reptiles, mother alligators and crocodiles protect their nests from hungry **predators**. Crocodiles usually dig a hole in the ground and lay as many as sixty eggs. They cover the hole with sand to keep the eggs warm. Alligators use leaves, branches, and mud to build their nest above the ground.
