

TAG QUESTIONS

We use tag questions at the end of a sentence to check that a statement is true. Example:

You like ice-cream, don't you?
She didn't sing at the party, did she?

TIP: To make TAG QUESTIONS we use the auxiliary verb from the main phrase and change it to the opposite polarity

You **have** played the violin for a long time, **haven't** you?
