

REINDEER

Reindeer grow up to 1.10 tall and can weigh up to 300 kg. They live for about 15 years. They can run up to 80 km/hour. They have to do so in order to flee from their enemies, the bears and wolves. Many people keep reindeer, as they can give a good milk and meat, pull sleds and carry light loads.
