

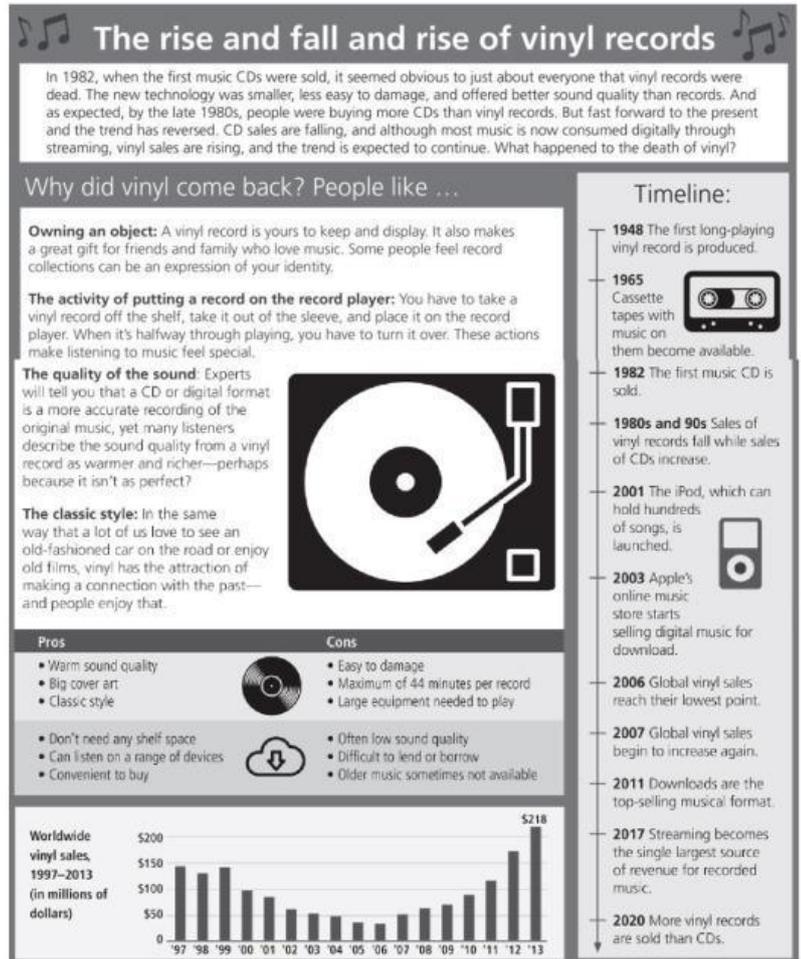

Trends in translation

The global translation services industry ¹_____ to be worth about \$40 billion today, although that's ²_____. And though translation should continue growing, ³_____ that the average pay for translators will increase as competition increases.

In fact, according to translator Anthony Teixeira, there has been a ⁴_____ in average pay for translation services in the past thirty years. Over that time, the use of computers in translation has increased and is expected to ⁵_____ in the future. However, the need for human translators is also expected to ⁶_____. Research indicates that the role of human translators has shifted from using computers to assist with translation, to computers performing the translation and people refining it.
