GRANGE HILL

In the UK, there is only one TV soap which takes place in a school. It is called *Grange Hill* and it started in 1978. Until 2007, the show was on the main BBC TV channel (BBC1), but then the BBC moved it to their special children's channel (CBBC) for the thirtieth series. The next series, which they are making now, will also be on CBBC.

In *Grange Hill*, the pupils are more important than the teachers. The programmes have stories about the usual problems that teenagers have. The plots include themes like boyfriends and girlfriends, trouble with parents and bullying. The stories about these issues upset some parents. When the series included a storyline about drugs and other bad behaviour, some parents stopped their children watching and wrote angry letters to the BBC. Teenagers liked these stories very much because they thought that they showed the good and the bad things about school life.

There are fourteen *Grange Hill* books, too. They are all novels except for the first book, which is a book of short stories. You can also find information about *Grange Hill* on its website at www.grangehill.com.
