

B1-03: Adverbials

Use of "after__" and "before__"

Before goes with the *latest* activity

After goes with the *earliest* activity

Example:

1: He gets up **after** he sleeps.

= **After** he sleeps, he gets up.

2: He ate **after** he cooked.

= **After** he cooked, he ate.

3: She studied **before** she took the exam.

= **Before** she took the exam, she studied.

4: She did her homework **before** she presented it to the teacher.

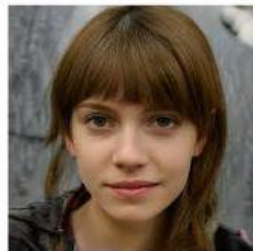
= **Before** she presented her homework, she did it.



1. Sometimes, the time adverbial can be reduced after a conjunction.
2. In reduced adverbials, the subject is dropped and the verb is turned into an *-ing* form.

1. They talked about it **before they met him**.
→ They talked about it **before meeting** him.
2. We left the office **after we finished the work**.
→ We left the office **after finishing the work**.
