- A.** In 2023, Moscow libraries celebrated registering their one-millionth reader and issuing 258,000 library cards, which is 21% more than the previous year. Over 10.9 million books were lent to readers, including 292,000 borrowed by Muscovites outside the library at special lending points and events. Moreover, in 2023, over 39 thousand events were organized in libraries attended by more than 2.1 million people.
- B.** The "Libraries of Moscow" online book search and reservation system, available on mos.ru, offers access to a unified catalogue of books available in all the libraries in Moscow. By using the system, you can easily locate the library that has the book you want to borrow, along with its address and working hours. The online service also allows you to extend the return period of the borrowed book, which has become the most popular feature of the system.
- C.** Libraries pay close attention to the renewal and replenishment of their collections. When purchasing books, they consider several criteria, including the originality and artistic level of the text. Special attention is given to new books in Russian, especially those that have won various awards. In 2023, about 389,000 books were added to city libraries, bringing the total size of their collections to 15.4 million editions.
- D.** In 2023, the most active readers were found to be Muscovites between the ages of 31 and 55. The most popular books among them were "Where the Crawdads Sing" by Delia Owens, "The Aviator" by Evgeny Vodolazkin, and "The Goldfinch" by Donna Tartt. As for children, schoolchildren aged 10 to 14 were the most active library readers. Their favourite books were Ivan Turgenev's "Mumu", Nikolai Leskov's "Levsha", and Toshiya Nishida's "Walking Haru".
- E.** In an effort to get closer to their potential readers, libraries participate in book fairs and festivals. The annual Red Square Festival, held from June 2nd to June 6th in 2023, included about 100 events such as book presentations, author meetings, artist performances, plays, and film screenings. In total, over 25,000 people attended these events hosted by Moscow libraries.
- F.** Moscow libraries are experiencing a second birth. Thanks to the city's program for the "Development of Cultural and Tourist Environment and Preservation of Cultural Heritage," the libraries have been transformed from traditional book repositories into modern centres for intellectual growth and creative self-expression. They now serve as comfortable city lounges, providing visitors with the opportunity to read books and magazines, watch films, study, or work.

Museum at the Bottom of the Sea

Artist Jason deCaires Taylor has created more than 500 life-sized sculptures of people. However, these works of art are not displayed in a traditional museum.

Instead, they are located in a most extraordinary setting – under the sea! Jason's unique creations can be found in two underwater sculpture parks in the Caribbean Sea. The first park is located near the island country of Grenada and has 65 sculptures. The second park is located in the National Marine Park of Cancun, Mexico, and has the world's largest collection of modern underwater sculptures – a total of 485.

To get a closer look at Jason's sculptures, you'll need to dive with scuba or snorkelling equipment. For those who prefer to stay dry, a glass-bottom boat provides an overhead view of Jason's wonderful artwork.

But why would anyone place such beautiful sculptures in the sand 3 to 10 meters beneath the waves?

The idea is to draw snorkelers and scuba divers away from the nearby coral reefs, which are delicate and easily damaged. Thousands of people swim around those reefs each year, accidentally harming the reefs and the sea animals that live within them. "If people instead swim around the beautiful sculpture parks," Jason explains, "it will give the reefs a rest."

Seven-year-old Sam Clarke has recently visited Grenada's underwater sculpture park. "I wore a snorkel set, which has my mask and snorkel," Sam says.

"On my feet, I wore fins that helped me swim quickly." Sam says he was impressed by the many different statues. "My favourite sculpture is *Circle of Children*. Standing together, 26 boys and girls are holding hands like they are friends under the sea."

Several weeks after Jason's statues were placed in the sea, sea plants and animals started to inhabit them. Sponges began growing on some of their faces, while algae, coral, barnacles, and seaweed grew on their bodies. This marine life then started to attract animals looking for food and shelter, including lobsters, angelfish, sardines, turtles, and barracudas. Within six years, only the rough shapes of the statues will remain because undersea creatures will have completely covered them.

Does it make Jason sad to see his artwork changing like that?

"No," he says.

"It's the part I like the most. Each visit is unique. Marine growth is taking on the role of the artist as it changes the sculpture."

As for Sam, he loved his visit! "Snorkelling in the underwater sculpture park is a good chance to get wet, see cool stuff, and swim with fish," he says. "Oh, and there's a sculpture of a man on a bike. It's very funny seeing a man riding his bike underwater!"
