

ADVERBS



If adjectives describe the noun, adverbs describe the verb

RULE:

add **-ly** to the adjective

Quiet >>>> Quiet**ly**
Beautiful >>>> Beautif**ul**ly
Loud >>>> Loud**ly**

Some accommodate the suffix:

Enthusiastic >>>> Enthusiastic**ally**
Happy >>>> Happ**ily**
Terrible >>>> Terrib**ly**
True >>>> Tru**ly**

EXCEPTIONS

Irregular adverbs

Good >>>> Well
Fast >>>> Fast
Hard >>>> Hard
Late >>>> Late
Straight >>>> Straight
Far >>>> Far
Wrong >>>> Wrong/ly

Friendly and lively are only adjectives

Points of time:

now, then, today,
tomorrow,
tonight,
yesterday,
before, after,
always, never
