SHORT COMPARATIVES

big, small, fast, tall, quick, bright, cold, calm, young, soft, strong, low, lucky, loud...

ADJECTIVE + ER + THAN

I am younger **than** my brother

(not) as + adjective + as

To compare similarities this way you don't need to add -er:

"Minecraft is **as fun as** Rocket League"

"Fornite is **not as complex as** Assassins Creed"

LONG COMPARATIVES

beautiful, useful, delicious, different, charming, important, difficult, handsome, intelligent...

MORE + ADJECTIVE + THAN

Dylan O'Brian is more **handsome** **than** Tayler Posey

Basically, you are comparing one to one. However, when you use superlatives, you compare one to many

SHORT SUPERLATIVES

Mirror, mirror, on the wall, who's **the fairest** of them all?

THE + ADJECTIVE + EST (*)



*of: a group
*in: a place

LONG SUPERLATIVES

Snow White is **the most beautiful** woman in this forest

THE + MOST + ADJECTIVE + (*)

IRREGULARS

GOOD - BETTER - THE BEST

BAD - WORSE - THE WORST

FAR - FURTHER - THE FURTHERST
(farther-farthest as well)
