

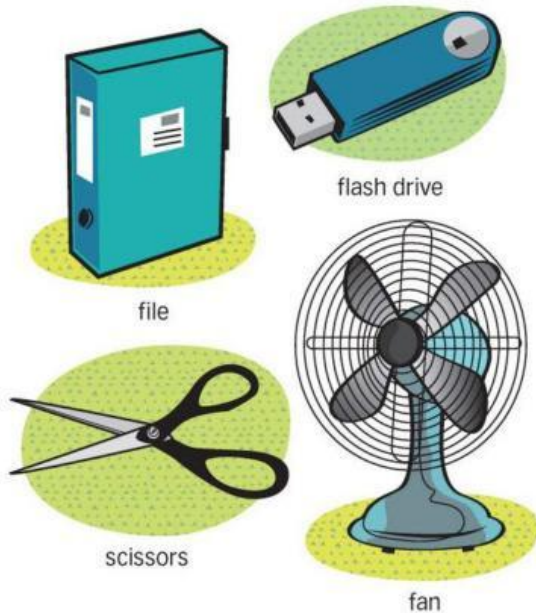

- 2 Listen to the description of an object. Which of these is he/she describing?

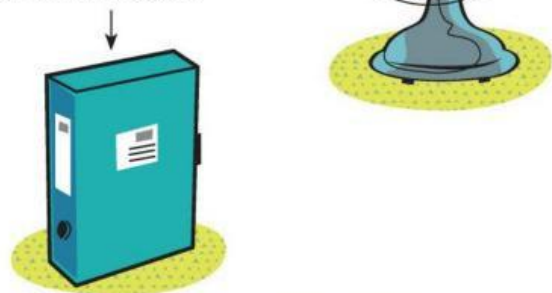


- 3 Give the name of the object and explain where to find it.
