How to Catch a Fish

Vicki Edwards nearly broke the standing record for the largest fish caught in Lake Buchanan. Vicki follows a simple guide to catch her fish, and she wanted to share it with our readers.

Step 1. Bait the hook.

Have an adult help you bait your hook. There are different kinds of bait to choose from. Knowing what kind of fish you are trying to catch will help you decide which bait to use.

Step 2. Cast your line.

After you cast your line, watch the water. Ripples or small waves may indicate that fish are near. It is important to be quiet so you won't scare the fish away.

Step 3. Reel the fish in.

If your line tugs, that may mean you have a fish. Reel it in quickly so your fish cannot get loose. If the fish is very heavy, you may need a net to help you get your fish into the boat.

Step 4. See your prize.

Most lakes and rivers have rules and regulations that tell you if a fish is large enough for you to keep. Be sure to check those rules before you go fishing. Whether or not your fish is large enough to keep, be sure to take a photo of it!
