'I've been determined to keep doing well at school even though I know my parents would understand if my grades were a little lower. It's been really hard but so far my schoolwork hasn't got worse at all.' Ellen also admits that for the last few weeks she has been spending less time in her studio to revise for the final exams. 'Although I'm absolutely convinced that I'll go on running the beauty shop, I also want to keep my options open for the future, so I'll do my best to get good exam results. In a longer term perspective, I might try to get a place at the Academy of Art
