

Adjective	Comparative	Superlative	Spelling
cheap	(than)	the	ends in consonant: + -er, the -est
nice	nicer (than)	the nicest	ends in -e: + -r; the + -st
big	(than)	the biggest	vowel + consonant: double consonant

**Example:** Their garden is **larger than** ours. Brian is **the thinnest** boy in the class.

### TWO-OR MORE SYLLABLE ADJECTIVES

easy	easier (than)	the easiest	two syllables ends in -y: y changes to -i
expensive	(than)	the	two or more syllables: no change

**Example:** The beach is **more crowded than** yesterday. It's **the easiest** way to do it. She is **the most famous** person I know.

### IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES

bad	worse (than)	the worst
good	than	the
far	farther / further (than)	the farthest / furthest

**Example:** The **best** restaurant was **the furthest** from the hotel.
