Kapoposang



Kapoposang is one of the largest of the Spermonde Islands, around 70 km northwest of Makassar, South Sulawesi. Kapoposang covers an area of around 50,000 hectares and is inhabited by around 100 families. Several other islands, both inhabited and uninhabited, lie near Kapoposang. The larger ones include Papandangan, Kondongbali, Suranti and Tambakulu.

Kapoposang and the nearby islands were declared a Nature Tourism Park by the Department of Forestry in 1999. Diving has been an important activity at Kapoposang since the mid 1990s. There were so few local divers at the time, and because of the distance from other well-known diving areas in Indonesia, Kapoposang has basically remained a secret.

The best time to visit Kapoposang is between April and November, when the seas are calm, the weather favorable, and the wind less fierce than in the other months. The trip takes two hours by speedboat; the ocean breezes help to cool your skin in the hot morning sun. As you approach Pulau Kapoposang, you see the deep blue water, which suddenly meets an expanse of coral reefs between extensive shallows with white sands in the seabed. Sea grass also grows lushly near the shore. The sea bed at Kapoposang has a unique composition; near the island are some quite shallow contours, and then suddenly steep underwater cliffs leading to seemingly endless depths. The water is very clear; you can expect underwater visibility of over 15 meters – ideal conditions for divers.

Phubbing was first coined as a term in May 2012. An Australian advertising agency created this word to describe the growing phenomenon of people ignoring their friends and family who were right in front of them and instead of scrolling through their phones.

One study found that more than 17 percent of people phub others at least four hour times a day. Almost 32 percent of people report being phubbed two to three times a day. While the behaviour might not seem like a big deal, research suggests phubbing may be hurting your relationships and your mental health. Read on to learn more.

Phubbing interrupts your ability to be present and engage with people around you. Today, almost all people own a smartphone, so the phubbing problem may be getting worse.

Besides that, the effect of phubbing may be worse on people who found themselves at the receiving end of the phubbing. When someone phubs you, you may feel rejected, excluded, and not important. That can have a significant impact on mental health.

Research also shows that people who are phubbed are more likely to reach for their phones and try to engage with their social media network to fill that void. This is the start of a vicious cycle.

Above all, phubbing is a learned behaviour. It only recently becomes a problem and you can unlearn it. It will take time and some work, but your mental health and your relationship will thank you for it.

Solar Eclipse

Have you ever seen a solar eclipse? It is a natural phenomenon that happens when the moon passes in front of the Sun and blocks it completely. When you look up into the sky at the Sun and the Moon, you will notice a strange coincidence that can make you feel curious because they both look like the same size in the sky and you will see really beautiful sight.

An eclipse occurs at the times when the Moon moves into a position of direct alignment with the Sun and the Earth. There are three types of solar eclipses; a total solar eclipse, a partial solar eclipse, and an annular solar eclipse.



A total solar eclipse occurs when the new moon passes directly between the Sun and the Earth. The moon's complete shadow (the umbra) sweeps across the narrow path of totality on the Earth. Daytime briefly turns into total darkness, and during these few precious minutes the halo of the Sun—the corona—comes into view as the dark disk of the Moon totally obscures the bright Sun. Outside the path of totality, in the Moon's partial shadow (the penumbra), some portion of the Sun's bright disk remains visible.

A partial solar eclipse also occurs when the Moon passes directly between the Sun and the Earth. However, only the penumbra touches our planet. The umbra passes either just above the North Pole or just below the South Pole, completely missing the Earth. A total eclipse is visible—only partial phases can be seen.

An annular solar eclipse occurs when the Moon's umbra passes across the Earth, but it doesn't take a long time to reach the surface; the shadow comes to a point before reaching the Earth. This effect happens when the Moon is farther out in its orbit around the Earth. The moon appears slightly smaller and is not completely large enough to cover the Sun. When the Moon is centered over the Sun, a ring of sunlight remains visible around the edge. Because the Sun is not completely covered by the Moon, the rare and dramatic effects of a total solar eclipse are not present at either annular or partial eclipses of the Sun.

It is quite remarkable that a solar eclipse can occur because the Sun and the Moon appear from Earth to be about the same size in the sky. The Sun, whose diameter is 400 times larger than the Moon, is about 400 times as far away from the Earth. This condition permits the Moon to cover up the Sun. In fact, if the Moon's diameter (2,160 miles) was just 140 miles less, it would not be large enough to completely cover the Sun.

Indonesia's largest international airports have stopped flights to and from China following the government's decision to impose a temporary travel ban to prevent the spread of the corona virus, which was first discovered in Wuhan.

State-owned airport operator Angkasa Pura II (AP II), which runs Soekarno-Hatta International Airport in Cengkareng, Tangerang, confirmed the stoppage on Wednesday.

"We have prepared for this matter with all stakeholders, especially all airlines that serve flights from Jakarta to China and vice versa. We hope that this temporary halt to flights will be understood by all parties," AP II president director Muhammad Awaluddin said, as quoted by Antara News Agency.

Soekarno-Hatta is the only AP II airport that serves scheduled and regular flights to and from China. Before the ban, there had been 16 flight routes from Soekarno-Hatta to several destinations in China and vice versa. The routes included flights to Beijing, Guangzhou Baiyun, Shenzhen Bao'an, Shanghai Pudong, Kunming, Nanning, Haikou Meilan, Fuzhou Changle, and Xiamen Gaoqi. During normal service, 143 takeoffs and landings occur weekly at the airport on these routes.

The airlines that offer flights between Jakarta and China are Air China, China Southern, Garuda Indonesia, Batik Air, Lion Air, Xiamen, China Eastern, Sriwijaya Air and Federal Express.

In addition to Soekarno-Hatta, Ngurah Rai International Airport in Denpasar, Bali has also temporarily stopped flights to and from China.

Disasters in Java Caused by Poor Spatial Planning

TEMPO.CO, Semarang - The Indonesian Forum for the Environment (Walhi) assessed that disasters occurring on Java Island were attributable to poor spatial planning. Consequently, Java contributed to the highest number of catastrophes in the archipelago.

Many areas on the island that should be water catchment areas have changed functions. "There is a function shift of protected areas to commercial use, whether for industry, offices, educational centers, or others. We call it spatial planning mismanagement," said Walhi's campaigner Abdul Ghofar in Semarang, Monday, January 23, 2023.

He noted that in the last four years, Java has become the epicenter of disasters in the country. In 2019, 2,351 disasters occurred, or 61 percent of the total national disasters. In 2020, there were 2,368 disasters, or 50.9 percent of the national disasters. In 2021, there were 2,511 disasters or 46.3 percent of the national disasters. In 2022, there were 1,839 disasters, or 51.8 percent of the national disasters.

"There are three provinces which over the past four years have become the three top biggest contributors to disasters in Indonesia. They are West Java, Central Java, and East Java," he said.

The massive conversion of land functions in Java has also been triggered by a large number of developments, both by government and private parties, including the national strategic project (PSN). "Java Island has 83 PSN, or 33 percent of the total PSN, with an investment value of Rp1,923 trillion," Abdul disclosed.

The high number of infrastructure development is also eased by licensing without adequate environmental standards. After the Government Regulation in Lieu of Law or Perpu on Job Creation Perpu and the Environment Minister's Regulation on the exception of the environmental impact analysis (Amdal) obligation were issued, the licensing process for spatial planning was relaxed.

Meanwhile, no big cities in Java have fulfilled the obligation of green open spaces. "None of the big cities in Java have fulfilled the spatial planning law, namely 30 percent areas allocated for green open spaces," Abdul underlined.

Walhi Central Java Executive Director Fahmi Bastian cited an example of mismanagement of spatial planning in Semarang. According to him, disasters often occurred in the city because the upper area which should function as a water catchment have turned into industrial and residential areas.
