The Great Pyramid of Giza

There are over a hundred pyramids in Egypt. The most famous is the Great Pyramid of Giza. This pyramid is over 4,500 years old. Until the early 19th century it was actually the tallest building on Earth! It stands next to the River Nile near the city of Cairo in Egypt. It is over 140 metres high and it took the Egyptian people twenty years to build. There are more than two million pieces of stone in the pyramid. You can still see a large and unusual kind of animal near this pyramid. It is called "The Sphinx" and it has the body of a Lion and the head of an Egyptian king.

You can learn a lot about Egyptian history if you look at the walls of the pyramid. On these walls are paintings of people and animals. The paintings show people lived in Egypt at that time.

You can go inside the pyramid but you have to buy a ticket. They sell 300 tickets each day, 150 in the morning at 8 a.m. and 150 in the afternoon at 1 p.m. You can't take photographs inside the pyramid.

If you are in Egypt you really must go and see the Great Pyramid of Giza!
