The Radfords have a big family because they love children! Life in their house is sometimes challenging, often noisy, but usually fun.

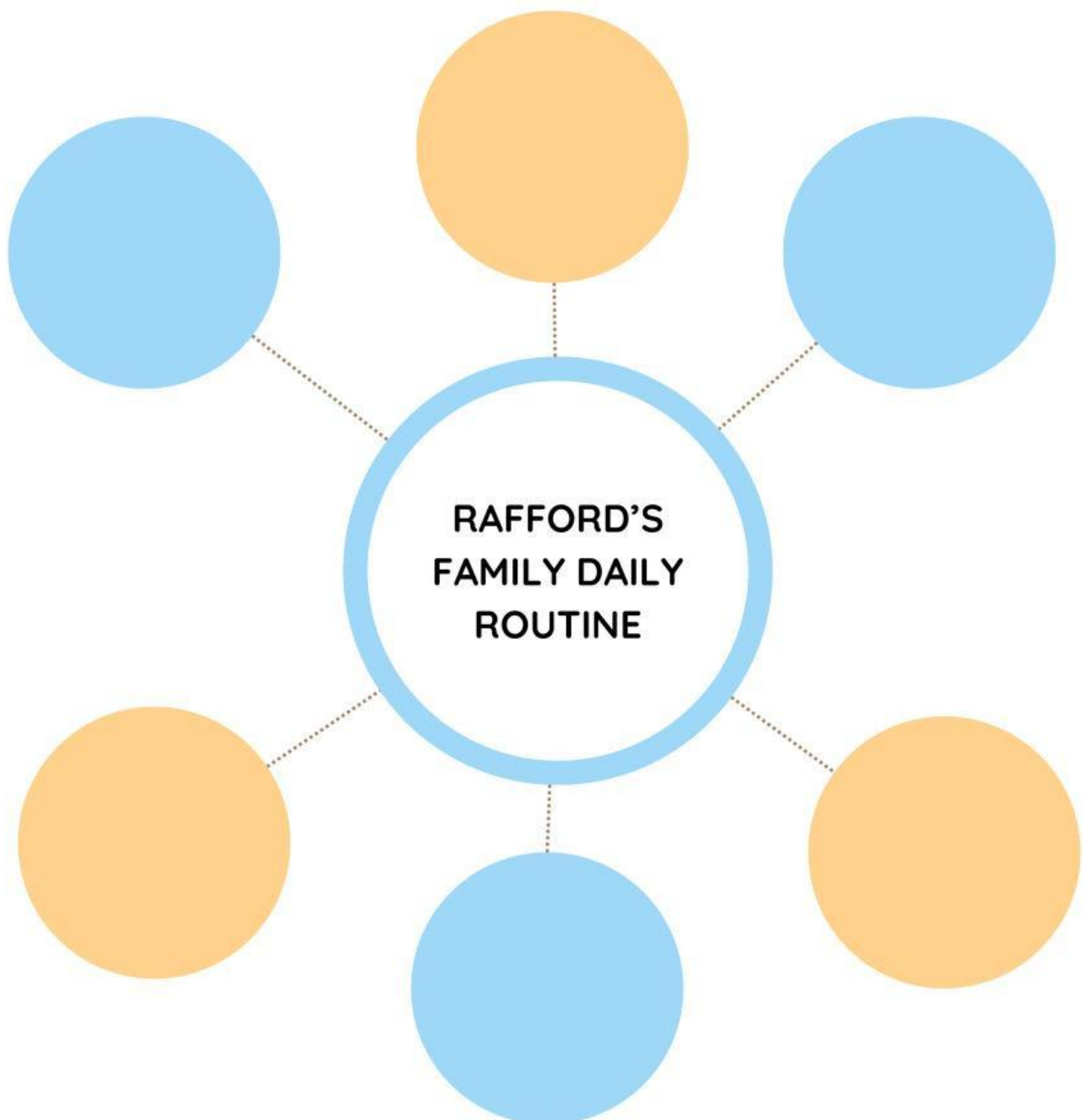
RAFFORD'S FAMILY DAILY ROUTINE
