However, forgiveness may be the best choice because it can set you free from negative emotions. The act of forgiving is a process that is made up of three psychological stages. 2. Getting the proper amount of exercise is an important thing we can do to ensure good health. However, is there such a thing as pursuing too much exercise? As it turns out, some people suffer from "exercise addiction" —working out to a degree that is far beyond __1__. 3. Different countries have unique ways of celebrating Mother's Day with special traditions recalling much about what's important in their cultures. The traditions may reflect history, religion, or shared __1__ values. Take Thailand, for example. August 12th is the day marked as Mother's Day because it's the birth date of Sirikit, the Queen Mother. 5. Taiwan was sometimes called "Boss Island" in the late 20th century. This was due to the many small and medium-sized firms that made up the country's economy. It is still true today that many Taiwanese __1__ to be their own boss. While a full-time job may offer some __2__, working hours are usually long and salaries are low.
