Be More Confident!

Robby is an attractive young man. With his bright blue eyes and dimples, he just looks like a cover boy. However, Robby used to feel very insecure about his appearance. At school, he seemed to have few friends. The reason why he was so reserved was that he had a dandruff problem. He never wanted to go to a barber for a hair cut.
