

7. TO CONCLUDE this test: WHAT WAS segregation?

Segregation may be defined as a **SEPARATION OF PEOPLE** in:

- PRIVATE PROPERTIES PUBLIC FACILITIES PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS

This separation was:

- RACE-BASED AGE-BASED CENSUS-BASED

In the USA it started in _ _ _ _ and finished in _ _ _ _ .

- 1861/1968 1861/1964 1865/1964

It was mainly in the _ _ _ _ _ states of the USA.

- WESTERN SOUTHERN NORTHERN

Each state had a different version of segregation laws. They are collectively called:

- John Crow Laws Jimmy Crew Laws Jim Crow Laws

Match examples of separation to their general scope:

EDUCATION	Coloured people could not attend the same concert halls or theatres as the white.
PUBLIC HEALTH SYSTEM	Coloured people could use the public means of transport in separate sections, compartments or separate waiting rooms.
SPORT	Coloured people could not attend the same holiday resorts, hotels, restaurants or public parks as the white. They could not even drink from the same public drinking fountains as the white.
TOURISM and PUBLIC FOOD CATERING	Coloured people could not go to the same schools as the white.
PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT	Coloured people could not go to the same hospitals as the white.
PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION	Coloured people could play only in separate championships or tournaments.
