Finn, 13 years old from the US

I don't actually go to school because my dad teaches me instead. Quite a lot of parents homeschool where I live so it's pretty normal. I really like studying at home because I can get up when I want to. If I feel tired when I wake up, I can stay in bed a bit longer, and I don't have to worry about being late for class. I also like choosing what I study. I do all the important subjects, like maths, English and science, but I also study topics that I find really interesting, like the Ancient Romans.

I do most of my studying online. It works for me because I can do things in my own time. If I find something difficult, I can spend more time on it. Agnes, 15 years old from Sweden

The schools where I live are pretty relaxed. We don't have to wear a uniform, we can call teachers by their first names and there aren't many rules. We can even use our mobile phones in class. We only get around one hour of homework a week because our teachers prefer us to do all our work in class and have free time in the evenings. That means we have more time for our hobbies and families. My favourite part of the school day is lunchtime. I love the food in our canteen. There's a different dish each day: usually some sort of meat or fish with potatoes, pasta or rice and a salad bar. Best of all, I love chatting to my friends – we all get on really well.

Narki, 14 years old from Ghana

I always wake up at 4.30 am. I have to collect the water from a well about 400 metres from my house. I finish around 6.30 am and get some breakfast. Then I get changed for school. Everyone must wear a uniform at my school. For me, it's a white shirt and a green skirt. It takes around 15 to 20 minutes to walk to school. We all have to study English, maths, science and social studies, but we can choose four other subjects. Mine are economics, geography, French and Dangme – the main language in my town, Asesewa. After I get home, I always work in our soft drinks shop until my mum arrives. Then I do my school assignments and watch a bit of TV. I am always in bed by 10 pm. If I don't get enough sleep, I find it hard to pay attention in class.
