

# Simple present statements

## PRESENT SIMPLE TENSE



⊕ Affirmative

| SUBJECT             | VERB |                |
|---------------------|------|----------------|
| I / you / we / they | +    | ... speak ...  |
| he / she / it       | +    | ... speaks ... |

⊕ Affirmative: I **speak** English.  
 ⊕ Affirmative: He **speaks** Spanish.  
 ⊕ Affirmative: They **live** in London.  
 ⊕ Affirmative: She **lives** in Paris.

Third person verbs need the final "s" in affirmative sentences.

I promote a campaign  
 She promotes a campaign

We manage social media  
 he manages social media

# Don't - Doesn't



We use **Don't** or **Doesn't** to make a **negative sentence** in the simple present tense.\*

\* Exceptions: Negative sentences that use To Be or Modal Verbs (can, might, etc.)

| Subject             | Auxiliary      | Verb                           |
|---------------------|----------------|--------------------------------|
| I / you / we / they | <b>don't</b>   | go ...<br>want ...<br>like ... |
| he / she / it       | <b>doesn't</b> |                                |

Affirmative: You **speak** English.

Negative: You **don't speak** English.

Affirmative: He **speaks** English.

Negative: He **doesn't speak** English.

\*\* The base form of the infinitive = ~~to~~ go, ~~to~~ need, ~~to~~ speak, ~~to~~ live  
Third person verbs lose the final "s" in negative sentences.

Be careful... I ~~no~~ live in Japan. ❌

I **don't live** in Japan. ✅

Affirmative: She **has** a cat. ✅

Negative: She **doesn't has** a cat. ❌

Negative: She **doesn't have** a cat. ✅

Contractions

**don't**  
= do not  
**doesn't**  
= does not
