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Tips for WASHING YOUR HANDS

Materials Needed:

1. Soap
2. Clean, running water
3. Paper towels or clean towel

Procedure:

1. Wet your hands with clean, running water. Adjust the temperature to your comfort, but avoid extremes of hot or cold water.
2. Apply soap to your hands. You can use either liquid soap or bar soap. Make sure to cover all surfaces of your hands.
3. Rub your hands together vigorously to lather the soap. Ensure you reach between your fingers, the backs of your hands, and under your nails. This step should last at least 20 seconds.
4. Don't forget to clean your wrists as well. Bacteria and germs can reside on this part of your hands too.
5. Rinse your hands thoroughly under clean, running water. Make sure all soap is washed away.
6. Dry your hands using a clean towel or paper towel. Pat your hands dry instead of rubbing vigorously to avoid irritation.
7. If possible, use a paper towel to turn off the faucet to avoid recontamination.
8. Dispose of the paper towel properly.
