Solving Equations using Equality Property of Multiplication

Example: Solve $\frac{x}{8} = 3$

Solution:

Multiply both sides by 8:

$$\frac{x}{8} \times 8 = 3 \times 8$$

$$x = 24 \leftarrow \text{answer}$$

Solving Equations using Equality Property of Division

Example: Solve $2x = 6$

Solution:

Divide both sides by **2**:

$$\frac{2x}{2} = \frac{6}{2} = 3$$

$$x = 3 \leftarrow \text{answer}$$
