THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT RIVER CRUISING

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Depending on the size, river ships can accommodate between 100 and 250 passengers, in contrast to an average ocean ship, which carries approximately 4,000 people. There are fewer cabins and, overall, they are much more compact. You won't get lost on board, and if you're travelling on your own, a river cruise will definitely give you an opportunity to make friends with other travellers and a very friendly crew.

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For most river cruises the dress code is smart casual. Forget about the expensive ball gowns and suits you have to purchase before going on a typical ocean cruise. You just need an outfit and footwear that you feel comfortable in and not necessarily a different one every day. A swimsuit is a must. You might also bring (optionally) something a bit more dressy for the farewell dinner.

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Shore excursions are usually included in the price of a cruise. Don't worry if you prefer travelling independently and think you might not like the guided tours on offer. You can always learn some facts about the destination that you are visiting from the maps and leaflets offered by the crew. Or you can join an organised tour just for a short while in the morning. Then, in the afternoon, you can have a wander by yourself at a pace you feel comfortable with.

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On a big ocean cruise ship, you can dress up and watch a different show every night, play golf or even go rock climbing (although it might cost a family well over £5,000). River cruising is more about the destination than the on-board entertainment. 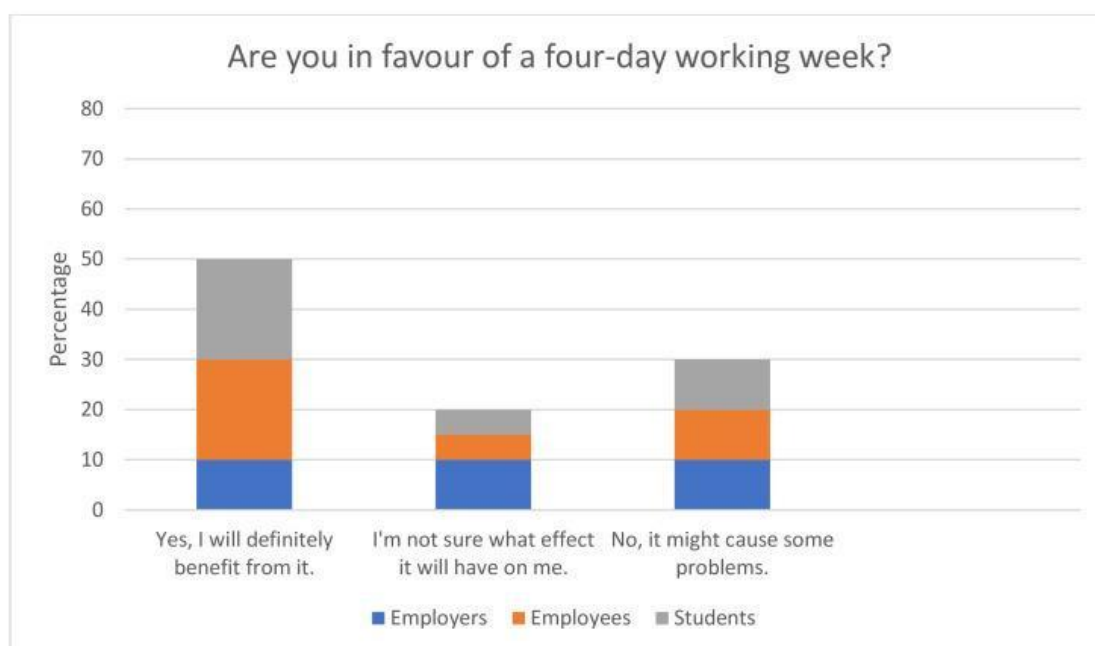

FOUR-DAY WORKING WEEK – IS IT THE WAY TO GO?

Over seventy companies in the UK which employ more than 3,000 people have agreed to take part in a six-month nationwide trial of a four-day working week with no change in pay. The companies and businesses, ranging from very small to very big, are testing out what could be the future of working life in the UK. So far, the opinions of those involved have been mixed. While some bosses have noticed a boost in productivity and increased employee satisfaction, others point to the chaos and confusion among their staff (as they take different days off each week). Having to complete work in four rather than five days makes the scheme quite challenging for those who prefer working at a slow steady speed. It remains to be seen whether the participating companies will continue with the four-day working week after the pilot programme has been completed.

Have you ever heard of WORDLE? If so, would you play it every day? These might seem like really silly questions because if you are a fan of word games, you're probably somewhere between partly and totally addicted to it by now. I can't help thinking that Wordle is not just a temporary fashion but will provide entertainment for years to come.

For the few of you who need it, here's a short explanation: Wordle is an online free puzzle in which the players' aim is to guess a five-letter word in six tries. After every guess, the player receives feedback: his/her chosen letter turns either grey, yellow or green. Grey means that a letter from the player's guess is not in the answer. If it is in the answer but not in the right position, the letter will turn yellow. Green indicates that the chosen letter is correct and in the correct place. If you feel like a bigger challenge, you can opt for the hard mode of the game, but the word, published daily, is the same for everyone around the world. In another version of the game, a colour blind mode, the colour scheme changes from green to orange and from yellow to light blue.

There's quite an unusual story behind the beginnings of this new brain teaser. Wordle was created by the British software engineer Josh Wardle, and its name is a wordplay on his own surname. The puzzle was actually a gift to his girlfriend, Palak Shah, who had always been keen on different kinds of word games, with crosswords and Spelling Bee being her favourite. For Palak, Wordle is Josh's wonderful expression of his love for her and a very sweet gesture. When the couple started playing, they quickly became obsessed with it. Josh published Wordle on the web and decided to share it with his family and close relatives. Then it was his friends' turn. Some of them were so enthusiastic about the new puzzle that they started exchanging their completed answers with each other. This served Josh as a source of inspiration and, within the next few months, a slightly revised Wordle became extremely popular on social media. Now it's available on the website of one of the biggest American mass media companies.

More and more people now train their brains with Wordle. Why has it taken the world by storm? Well, the answer is simple: it's just a fun thing to do online. Best of all, you don't need to register or have an account and so you're not sent annoying emails or notifications. Wordle is a competitive game as everybody gets the same word to guess and players can later post their results. But, I suppose, you can say that it's less competitive than some other online puzzles. Another advantage is that you don't need to spend more than two to three minutes a day on it. I hope it will be the case for me one day too as my first go at Wordle took over five times longer!

PARENTS DON'T GET THEIR CHILDREN'S ONLINE LANGUAGE

An interesting research study into online communication was conducted in the UK by an information site some time ago. **7.1.** ____ The survey employed in the research found that over 80% of young people (10–18 years old) make use of Internet slang while communicating online. At the same time, a much lower percentage of their parents were able to define the most popular netspeak terms correctly. **7.2.** ____ For teens and adults alike, 'trolling' was the most familiar term, with 58% of them being able to identify its meaning. 28% of the parents surveyed had no problems with understanding the warning POS (Parent Over Shoulder). **7.3.** ____ It clearly shows that most parents might feel cut off from their children's world and not be able to identify potentially risky online behaviour. **7.4.** ____ Their aim is to enable parents to understand and communicate with their teenage children. Now, they will be able to get involved in their children's cyberlives and support them.
