Eurovision Junior is an annual music competition organised by the European Broadcasting Union (EBU) for young singers aged between 9 and 14. It has been running since 2003 and has become one of the most popular music events for children in Europe.

History of the contest

The idea of a Eurovision for children came about in 2002, inspired by the success of the adult contest. The first edition was held in Copenhagen, Denmark, and was won by Dino Jelusić from Croatia with the song "Djelovanje". Since then, the contest has grown in popularity, with over 20 countries participating each year.



Some famous winners

Some of the most famous winners of Eurovision Junior include Roksana Węgiel from Poland (2018), Eleni Foureira from Greece (2004) and María Isabel from Spain (2004). María Isabel is the only Spanish representative to have won the contest to date.



Spain's participation in the last three years

Spain has had moderate success in Eurovision Junior in recent years. In 2019 Melani came 3th with her song "Marte". In 2021, Levi Díaz came 8th with the song "Penalti". Last year, Sandra Valero came 2nd with her song "Loviu".
