It can help to treat various physical ailments like cancer, arthritis, hypertension, obesity, chronic pain, and cardiovascular disease. It also is effective in (c)treating mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, dementia, and low self-esteem.

In a study from The Arts in Psychotherapy, researchers found that dance therapy had a positive impact on people with depression.
