

Subjects

The subject of a verb is “who” or “what” the sentence is about.

Example:

Bob eats a burger.

“Bob” answers the question:

Who or What is the sentence about?

“Bob” is the subject.

Question 1

Identify the Subjects in each sentence by rewriting it in the box provided.

Predicates

A simple predicate is just the verb in a sentence.

Example:

Bob is happy.

Bob eats a burger.
