## HYPOTHETICAL OR UNREAL SITUATIONS

### PAST CONDITION (=3RD CONDITIONAL)

If clause (condition)

If a condition **had existed**

past perfect (simple and continuous)

### PRESENT RESULT (=2ND CONDITIONAL)

main clause (result)

the result **would be** true.

would/could/might + infinitive

If I **had won** the lottery, I **would be** rich.

### PRESENT CONDITION (=2ND CONDITIONAL)

If clause (condition)

If a condition **existed**

past (simple and continuous)

### PAST RESULT (=3RD CONDITIONAL)

main clause (result)

the result **would have been** true.

would/could/might + have + past participle

If I **were** a man, they **would have given** me the job.

### Identify the past and present segments:

- If the patient had followed the prescribed diet, PAST/PRESENT  
he wouldn't be experiencing such severe hypertension now. PAST/PRESENT
- If she weren't allergic to penicillin, PAST/PRESENT  
the doctor would have prescribed it for her infection last week. PAST/PRESENT
- If the surgeon had double-checked the medical records, PAST/PRESENT  
the wrong procedure wouldn't be being questioned now. PAST/PRESENT
- If he didn't have a history of heart disease, PAST/PRESENT  
he might have been considered for the clinical trial last year. PAST/PRESENT
- If the vaccine had been administered on time, PAST/PRESENT  
the outbreak might not be spreading so rapidly. PAST/PRESENT

### Only one option is correct. Which one?

- If the patient hadn't ignored the early symptoms, she (wouldn't be suffering / wouldn't have suffered) from advanced cancer now.
- If the hospital had invested in better equipment, the diagnostics (would be / would have been) more accurate today.
- If the nurse had reported the error immediately, the patient's condition (wouldn't have deteriorated / wouldn't be deteriorating) so rapidly last week.
- If he were more diligent about taking his medication, he (would have avoided / would avoid) last month's complications.
