Demi Skipper has recently been given the keys for her new home in Tennessee, USA. Getting a new house can be an exciting experience for anyone, but there's nothing strange about it. So why has Demi's achievement been in the headlines? It's because it didn't cost her a cent. Instead, she "traded up" her possessions.

If you exchange something you have for something better, then you have traded up.
