PRESENT PERFECT vs PAST SIMPLE

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WE DON'T SAY WHEN STH HAPPENED (IT'S RELEVANT NOW)

- I've finished my essay.
(It's done now.)
- He has left.
(He's not here now.)

WE SAY OR ASK WHEN STH HAPPENED

- When did you finish your essay?
- He left after the game.
- I didn't go to work yesterday.

WE MENTION A PAST EXPERIENCE OR RECENT EVENT

- She has won two gold medals.
- I've broken my arm.
- They have travelled a lot.

WE ASK ABOUT OR GIVE THE DETAILS

- She has won two gold medals.
She got the first one in Tokyo and...
- "I've broken my arm." "How did it happen?" "I fell in the park."

UNFINISHED TIME

- He has lived in Japan for years.
(=He still lives in Japan.)
- How long have you been married?
(=You are still married.)

FINISHED TIME

- He lived in Japan for years.
(=He does not live in Japan now.)
- How long were you married?
(=You aren't married anymore.)

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
