Franco. Exploration practice. Exploration reasons

1. Case #1

During the 1600s, Portuguese colonizers arrived in South America. The king of Portugal wanted to control more resources and people. The Portuguese could also collect taxes from the Portuguese Americans. The taxes on the Portuguese Americans were too high and they rebelled against the king. The king's goal to control people and resources made everybody upset.
