Use: describe things that are always true. - If you mix red and yellow, you get orange. describe what happens in general. - If I have free time, I read books. (talking about my hobby in general)	Form: If + present simple, S + will + V + O. Use: describe things that are likely to happen in the future. - If I have time, I will help you. describe a particular situation. - If I'm free tonight, I'll go out with my friends (talking about what will happen today, another day might be different) give instructions (If + present simple, imperative) - If you need help, tell me.
