1. What tense do we use to talk about a specific point in the past? past simple / past perfect
 2. What tense do we use to talk about something that happened before this specific point in the past? past perfect / past simple
 3. What tense do we use to talk about something that was in progress at the moment of speaking? past simple / past continuous

IV. Past perfect and past simple

1. We form the past perfect with: Subject + **have / had** + **past / past participle**
 2. We form the past continuous with: Subject + **was and were / only was** + verb **ing**
 3. We form the past simple with: Subject + **regular verb + ed or irregular verb in past / only verb + ed**
