

- Pronouns have the following subjective and objective forms :

Subjective form	I	we	you	he	she	it	they
Objective form	me	us	you	him	her	it	them

- The words **and + I** and **and + me** are used in the following ways:

(a) noun / pronoun subject + **and + I**

EXAMPLES:

Sue **and I** will come for the party.

You **and I** are to take charge of the kids.

(b) noun / pronoun object + **and + me**

EXAMPLES:

Mrs Lee asked Mary **and me** to help her.

Dad reminded you **and me** to clean the garage.
