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Cafés

- A** **Tempo** is in an old library building, and serves different dishes every week! The café isn't big, but its plain white walls and windows looking onto the narrow street make it light inside. It's on a popular route for runners, so watch them going past while you enjoy your meal.
- B** **Marsden's** is in a new building by the river, so you can watch the colourful little boats sailing past as you have a meal. It's perfect for a peaceful break during a busy day. Marsden's always serves traditional meat and fish dishes, and fantastic cakes and ice creams. People travel for miles to try them!
- C** **Violet's** is in an 18th-century house with a garden that's even large enough for a game of badminton! It's always lively and busy. Regular customers love it because they know they'll always find the same wonderful dishes there, and great desserts – such as cakes and ice creams, all at low prices!
- D** **Impey's** has large tables perfect for big groups of customers, both inside and in its garden. And even if you come here frequently, you'll still find new dishes on offer each week! Impey's is always busy, and has a great atmosphere – as well as fantastic artworks on its walls!
- E** As **Butterfly** is by the main cricket ground, it attracts local players who eat there in big groups after matches – it has lots of space inside. The unusual bright colours and huge art posters give it a cheerful atmosphere – great for meeting friends. The food's good, too, although it can be a bit expensive.
- F** The modern **Royale** café serves a range of tasty meals, including meat-free dishes. Surprisingly few people know about it, so you can stay in the peace of the little café and garden as long as you wish. Sunny yellow walls and fantastic art posters make it the happiest place in town!
- G** **Sands Café** usually attracts lots of people calling in after watching a game at the stadium nearby, because of its convenient location and lively atmosphere – and its delicious dishes, none of which cost a lot. You may even see famous players trying the fantastic hot meals!
- H** **Jerry's** is in one of the oldest streets in town, in what was once the town hall. Inside, you'll find lovely cream-coloured walls, comfortable sofas – and a great selection of books to entertain you as you eat their tasty sandwiches! The café also displays work by local painters and photographers.
