2) Disinformation

3) Misinformation

4) Opinion

A specific type of fake news deliberately designed to mislead using material that the deceiver knows is untrue. It's meant to be widely shared.

5) Parody / Satire

An umbrella term for false, misleading, or out-of-context material, regardless of the motivation behind it.
