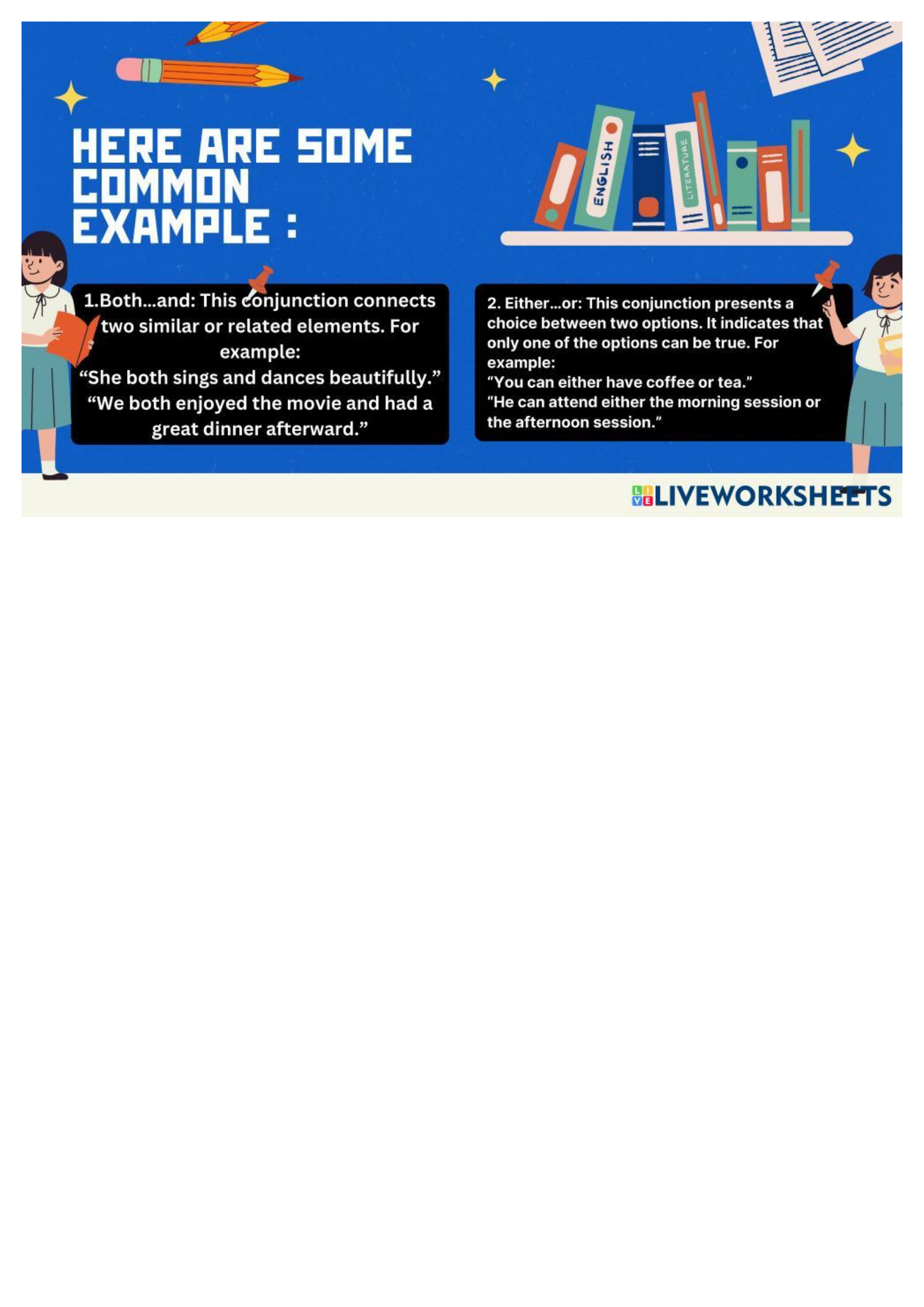

DEFINITION

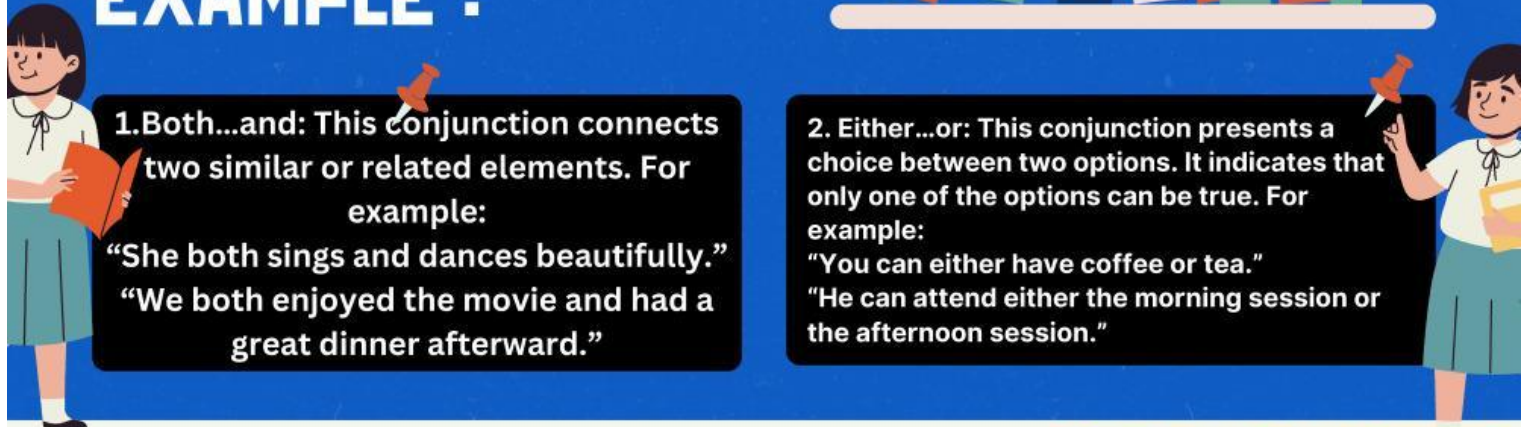


Paired conjunctions, also known as correlative conjunctions, come in sets, working together to link similar elements within a sentence. They help maintain a balanced and parallel structure.





HERE ARE SOME COMMON EXAMPLE :

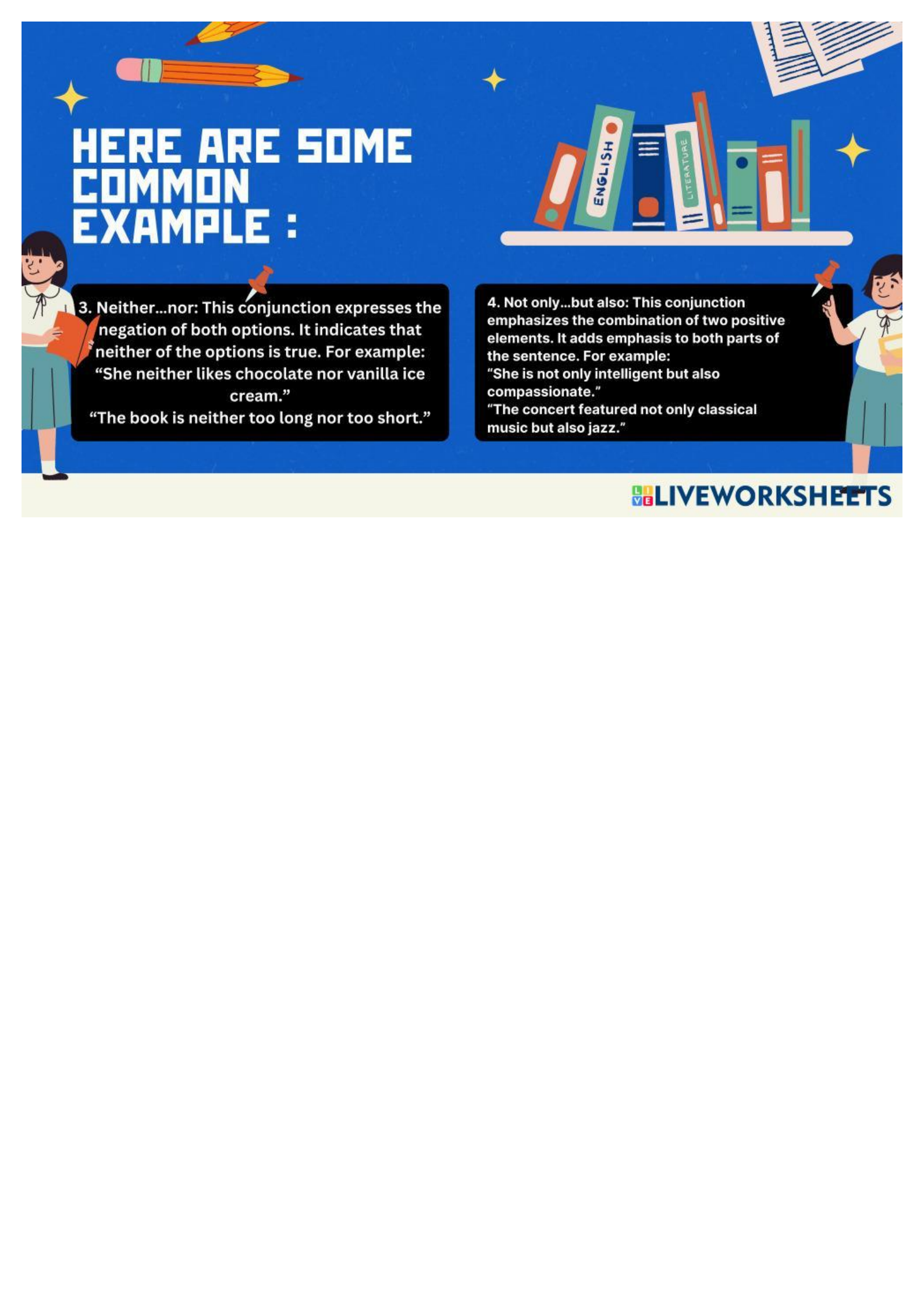


1. Both...and: This conjunction connects two similar or related elements. For example:

“She both sings and dances beautifully.”
“We both enjoyed the movie and had a great dinner afterward.”

2. Either...or: This conjunction presents a choice between two options. It indicates that only one of the options can be true. For example:

“You can either have coffee or tea.”
“He can attend either the morning session or the afternoon session.”



HERE ARE SOME COMMON EXAMPLE :



3. **Neither...nor:** This conjunction expresses the negation of both options. It indicates that neither of the options is true. For example:
"She neither likes chocolate nor vanilla ice cream."
"The book is neither too long nor too short."



4. **Not only...but also:** This conjunction emphasizes the combination of two positive elements. It adds emphasis to both parts of the sentence. For example:
"She is not only intelligent but also compassionate."
"The concert featured not only classical music but also jazz."
