Fishing for bicycles

Amsterdam has got a lot of canals, around 100 kilometres in all, and also a large number of bikes – probably about a million. (2) _____. Whilst they're a useful way of getting around, when they end up in the canal they can be a real problem for the many boats operating in the city.
- 10 In the 1960s people started to fish for bikes and remove them from the canals. As a result, there are a number of official bike fishers who do the job full-time in Amsterdam. (3) _____. They learn a lot of things in this time, including how to look for and pick up the bikes correctly. Bike fishers can really help the environment because the metal from the bikes can be recycled and reused. The man on the boat is now pulling two dirty old bikes out of the water. He looks quite happy with himself – the bikes are in good condition. This means

Fishing for bikes is a calm and relaxing job, just like the more traditional hobby. The bike fishers are generally busier in winter. (5) _____. This means the fishers have more time to search the water more carefully and find more bikes.

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
