- **mess** (n.): a situation in which a place is dirty or not neat
(สภาพรกรสกปรก)
- **cage** (n.): a structure made of wires or bars in which birds or animals can be kept (กรง)
- **ferret** (n.): a small animal, used for hunting rats and rabbits
(สัตว์คล้ายพังพอนใช้ล่าหมูหรือกระต่าย)
- **Whew!** เป็นคำอุทานเวลาได้กลิ่นอะไรเหม็น ๆ หรือเมื่อรู้สึกร้อนเหนื่อย หรือ โล่งอก
- **You're grounded** เป็นการบอกรักเด็กว่า “เรอคุกคักบริเวณ” ไม่ให้ออกไปไหนกับเพื่อนเป็นการลงโทษ
